## The Rules Corner.....

How do you drop a ball when taking relief? Here's some information. Check out Rule 14.3 for more.

What is the proper procedure for dropping a ball in the relief area?

1. The ball must be dropped from knee height and must be dropped straight down without rolling, throwing or spinning the ball. Knee height means the height of your knee when standing.
2. The ball must first land in the relief area (or on the line when taking back-on-the-line relief) and not touch you or your equipment before it touches the ground.

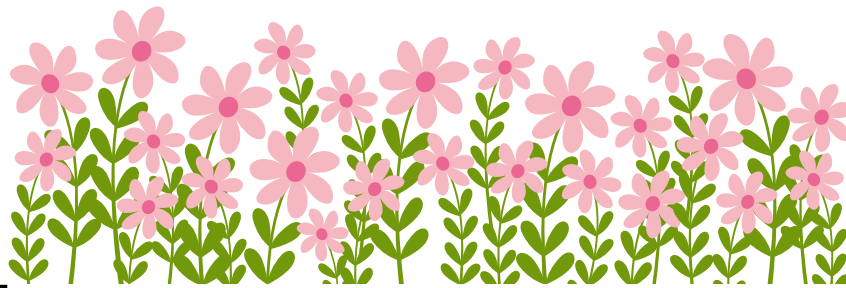
Examples of improperly dropped balls:

- a. The ball first lands outside the relief area. It must be re-dropped even if it rolls back into the relief area.
- b. The ball hits you or your equipment before it hits the ground. It's okay if it hits you or your equipment after it hits the ground unless you intentionally caused it to happen.
- c. You drop the ball from higher or lower than knee height.

If the ball is improperly dropped, it must be re-dropped as many times as necessary to get a proper drop. Improper drops do not count towards your two drops when determining when to place the ball.

A properly dropped ball must remain in the relief area. If it does not, it must be properly dropped a second time. If it doesn't stay in the relief area a second time it must be placed where it first touched the ground\*\*.

\*\*If the ball won't stay in that spot with two tries then find the spot nearest that spot where the ball will stay. That spot might be outside the relief area.
